The site is not suited to the proposed Housing Development.

1 Contrary to what has been written elsewhere, access from Colyton is not easy. Twenty minutes uphill walking for a fit person; at least 30 minutes for the less able or those with children. This is via Hill Head, a narrow road, largely without footways. Residents will find it necessary to use motor vehicles - parking in the centre of Colyton has already reached saturation, so where do they go?

Both roads to the south are narrow, unlit and largely without pavements, used by children on foot to access the Grammar School. Clay Lane is no longer a useable road.

- 3 Where is the storm water runoff to go, through Colyton?

Does anyone really want East Devon looking like so much of the south coast, 'a house behind every tree'?
