Neighbourhood planning provides a **powerful set of tools** for **local people** to ensure that they get the **right types of development** for their community where the ambition of the neighbourhood is aligned with the strategic needs and priorities of the **wider local area.**' *

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN STARTS TO TAKE SHAPE

A neighbourhood plan that will help to inform and shape development in Ottery St Mary Parish is a step nearer following public consultations at West Hill, Ottery Town, Tipton St John and Escot, and at a special event with the pupils of The Kings School.

Ottery Mayor, Glyn Dobson, said, "I would like to thank everyone who came along to one of the September consultation events and gave us their views and ideas about how they would like to see our communities develop over the next 16 years up to 2031."

The next few months will be a very busy time for the Ottery Neighbourhood Plan Working Group made up of local residents and councillors as they carry out supporting research and start to develop possible ideas about how to enable developments that will provide what local people want in their communities, how the local economy and community services can be sustained and developed, and how the precious local environment can be protected.

Next steps include a public meeting in January/February 2016 to explore initial ideas and thoughts towards developing the plan.

NOTE TO EDITORS:

East Devon District Council agreed in January 2015 to designate the whole Parish (from West Hill to Wiggaton and Fenny Bridges to Tipton St John) as the area for a neighbourhood plan.

Accomplished Alfington artist Phil Creek was called into action recently when the Ottery Parish Neighbourhood Plan Working Group found itself needing a logo to be produced from a hurriedly sketched idea - in double quick time. After considering various locally suggested options, the Group agreed to develop a suitable theme from a promising last minute sketch based around an Otter, submitted by a supportive member of the public.

Phil Creek responded to the call for help at short notice, and quickly transformed the idea into a high quality drawing, neatly capturing the Parish's mix of town and country locations which will be at the heart of the finished plan. The result is already appearing on neighbourhood plan documentation. Phil told the Parish Pump: "I was delighted to be asked, and very pleased to contribute my skills to an important local development."
