The Steering Committee have sent a draft of the Basic Conditions Statement to Martin Parkes for his comments. Martin Parkes is the Neighbourhood Plan representative for the Community Council of Devon and has been invaluable in pointing the Steering Committee in the right direction.

A copy will then be passed over to Tim Spurway, East Devon District Council's officer responsible for Neighbourhood Plans and he will also look over the draft.

Once all the alterations and corrections are taken on board, the Neighbourhood Plan will go out to the various statutory bodies for consultation before being presented to a Planning Inspector for approval.

Residents will still be to have a final say with a referendum to confirm acceptance of the Plan. .
