Key points

- Benefit two or more town or parish council areas.
- Communities working together to make a difference.
- Between £400 and £30,000, with quotations.
- Have 20% of the costs before applying.
- Charity, Community Interest Company, town or parish council. Voluntary or community group with an accountable eligible organisation.
- Not Exmouth.

Examples of projects funded under the old Parishes Together Fund that would have potentially been eligible for the new Communities Together Fund:

- Creating extra community allotments in Whimble that can also be let to residents of nearby Rockbeare. £2,385.
- For a reputable theatre production about child sexual exploitation to Year 9 secondary school students throughout East Devon. £4,790.
- A trial project to support town guides, tourism websites and a physical tourism presence in Exmouth and Honiton. £37,090.

Trial of a course for young people on personal wellbeing - £4,500

- Broadclyst and Rockbeare parishes.
- Young people took part in outdoor activities whilst completing a personal wellbeing course. Delivered by YMCA.
- Had been in schools before but not in a community setting.
- All young people produced brilliant portfolios of well thought out work and achieved a qualification.

- The trial of a mental health project specifically for young people, carried out by The Project. £2,700.
- Educational countryside signage for footpaths between Otterton and Woodbury. £3,289.
- For Talaton and Whimble community theatre group to put on a production of Godspell. £800.

Axe Valley Youth Netball Club - £3,946.50

- Axminster Town Council and Kilmington Parish Council.
- Set up costs for Axe Valley Youth Netball Club.
- Kit, hall hire, training aids, expert coach session.
- Encourages participation in sport, social and personal skills, mental and physical wellbeing.

- Purchasing Christmas lights and sharing / rotating the lights between Exmouth and Honiton. £36,787.
- Putting an open to use public toilet into a new community building in Ottery St Mary. £6,330.
- Community helipad for the Air Ambulance in Axminster, All Saints, Chardstock, Kilmington. £5,171.
