Thank you for providing Highways England with the opportunity to comment on the submission draft of the Otterton Neighbourhood Plan. Highways England is responsible for operating, maintaining and improving the strategic road network (SRN), which in this case comprises the M5 and the A30 some distance to the west and north of the plan area.

We were previously consulted on the pre-submission draft of the Neighbourhood Plan in June 2019. Following a review of the submission draft we remain satisfied that the proposed policies within the plan are unlikely to result in development which will adversely impact the SRN and we therefore have no specific comments to make. This does not however prejudice any future responses Highways England may make on site specific applications as they come forward through the planning process, and which will be considered by us on their merits under the prevailing policy at the time.
