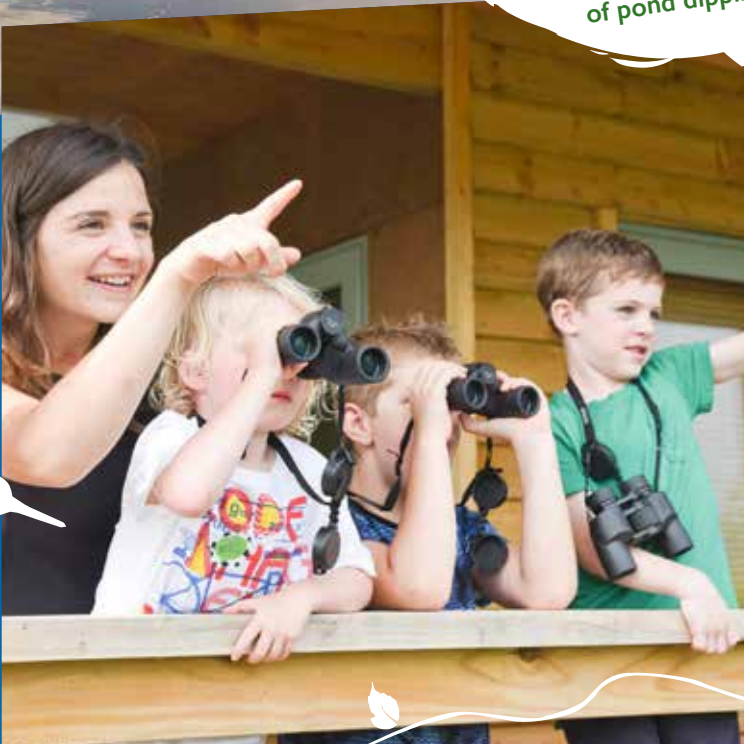

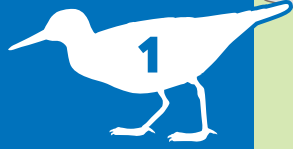


Explore Seaton Wetlands

Colyford Common
