The village is bisected by a railway line with a level crossing that causes inconvenience, nuisance and traffic safety issues. Further mass housing will add to these problems. We also object to the loss of open countryside, productive agricultural land and wildlife habitat that could be avoided by developing brownfield sites instead.

We agree that the "Rejected" (Red) sites at Feniton should not be developed.

We agree that as one of the "Tier 4 Service Villages" in the Plan, development should be "modest" and "to meet local needs". This could be achieved by the provision of 42 homes at the "Preferred Location" (Green) in the draft plan; the former Burlands Mead Nursery site.
