With reference to the above plan I wish to register my objection based on the reasons below:

This is an area of outstanding natural beauty and would cause immense damage to wildlife.

This is currently a dark sky site which would be lost due to light pollution.

Access via Honeysuckle Drive (via Old Elm Road) would increase traffic through a quiet residential area with a risk of flooding to properties directly adjoining the land.

Old Elm Road is poorly maintained already, it is like a slalom to avoid the potholes. Increased traffic would only make this worse. As you appear to be unable to maintain the existing road I feel that more traffic would only exacerbate the situation.

The GP surgery and local schools are already over capacity and there is no provision to resolve this. By adding to the local population this would only become worse.

The local drainage adjacent to old Elm Road floods regularly and building more properties nearby would only make this worse.

Honeysuckle Drive which is currently a quiet cul de sac would become a main access road causing increased traffic, loss of privacy to residents and increased noise levels.

Sidmouth Road is already a busy main road and I feel that putting an access road from there would be dangerous and disruptive.

This site has already been refused planning permission for very valid reasons. No meant No, not we'll leave it a few years then try again.
