

Carbon Action Fund (CAF) Planning Permission Guidance

This document provides guidance on cases of common decarbonisation projects which always require planning permission. Your project **may** still require planning permission, even if it does not fulfil the below criteria.

Cases where Planning Permission is required include:

Solar Panels mounted on the roof or wall of a non-domestic building:

- For a building within a Conservation Area or within a National Landscape (formerly known as Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty), planning permission is required if the solar equipment would be installed on a wall which fronts a highway.
- If the solar equipment would be installed on a roof **and** within 1 metre of the external edge of that roof.
- If the solar equipment would be installed on a listed building or on a building within the curtilage of a listed building.

Stand-alone Solar Panels on a non-domestic property if:

- The development would result in the presence of more than 1 stand-alone solar installation at the premises.
- The solar equipment would exceed 4 metres in height **or**, if within a Conservation Area or National Landscape (formerly known as Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty) 2 metres in height (if the solar equipment is nearer to any highway than the building).
- The solar equipment would be installed within the curtilage of a listed building, **or** within 5m of the boundary to a neighbouring listed building property.
- The surface area of the solar panels would exceed 9 square metres, or any dimension of its array (including any casings) would exceed 3 metres.

A ground source heat pump for a non-domestic building if:

- The total area of excavation would exceed 0.5 hectares.
- The development would result in more than 1 ground source heat pump at the premises.

A water source heat pump for a non-domestic building if:

• The total surface area covered by the water source heat pump (including any pipes) would exceed 0.5 hectares.
